Subject Specifics Writing


• Being a Writer

- Published by Developmental Studies Center
- Skill practice will focus on grammar, usage, and mechanics skills that supplement our writing instruction.

Subject Specific

Math

- Investigations in Number, Data, and Space
- Written by TERC, published by Pearson
- Designed for students to investigate relationships and concepts about numbers rather than learning formulas by rote.

- Making Meaning
- Published by Developmental Studies Center
- Designed to scaffold students as they learn to use effective reading strategies.

- Sangari Active Science

- Uses 5 E's model: Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate, Evaluate

Florida Standards Assessment

Fourth Grade

Everything is paper-based

- Reading
- Math

 - Not prompt based. Instead, students are given several texts on a topic and are then asked to respond to a stimulus about that topic using information from the texts to support their answer.
 - Informative or Opinion

Fifth Grade

Computer-based tests

Homework

Math

Math Homework is weekly. Packets will come home each Friday (or last day of the week) and is due the following Friday (or last day of the week).

Reading

Students expected to read daily, for 20-30 minutes.

Writing

Writing homework will be distributed each Friday, or the last day of the week, and will be due the following Friday, or the last day of the week. The homework will focus on consistent skills practice and responding to texts students have read.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 schooldays, and Student C will have read for 3.

Homework

Late Work

This is not the same as Secondary Help Sessions – teachers will be available for questions, but not one-on-one tutoring.
